Please Note:

After Four Programme

The After Four Programme operates on school days from 3:45 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. for students in Grades JK to 8. Students not picked up by 3:45 p.m. will be signed into the After Four Programme by their homeroom teacher.

- 3:45 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. is a 15 minute grace period at no charge
- 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. is charged at \$8.00 per hour
- Late charges of \$25.00 every 10 minutes will apply after 6:00 p.m.

Dismissal after Clubs

Parents/Guardians are to pick students up after club at their appointed club location within the school, not at their homeroom. Students not immediately picked up will be signed into the After Four Programme and will be billed accordingly.

Attendance

Safe Arrival Programme

Your child(ren)'s safe arrival at school is confirmed on a daily basis through our Safe Arrival Programme. The Safe Arrival Programme consists of the following steps:

- Parents/guardians are requested to notify the Main Office when their child(ren) is going to be late or absent from school. Messages regarding a student being absent or late from school can be left on the KBS Main Office voice mail at 739-4731 Ext. 101.
- At 9:00 a.m. each day attendance records are processed by the Main Office. **The Main Office will contact parents/guardians to confirm the whereabouts of any student who is absent or late without explanation, or if a student arrives late to class without signing in at the Main Office.** If the parents/guardians cannot be reached, the Main Office will begin contacting the people on the student's emergency contact list, until the whereabouts of the student has been confirmed.

Late Arrival

Students arriving after 8:35 a.m. are considered late, and must sign in at the Main Office and obtain a late slip to gain entry to their classroom. Punctuality is expected on the part of each student.

Leaving School Property

When a student leaves the school for an appointment, the parent/guardian must sign the child out and in at the Main Office. No student is permitted to leave the school during school hours, unless accompanied by a parent/guardian or an authorized KBS staff member.

Students Leaving School Property with those other than a Parent/Guardian

Students are permitted to leave school with those individuals outlined on their Student Information Form only. Parents/guardians wishing anyone to pick up their child(ren) from school, other than those outlined on their child(ren)'s Student Information Form, must provide consent in writing or verbally to the Main Office. Any authorized individual who is not known to the Main Office staff will be asked to present identification upon arrival at school for pick up of the student.

Family Vacations During the School Year

In keeping with other Independent Schools, our academic year is more compact than that of the public sector, and our holiday schedule is generous. For these reasons, Kempenfelt Bay School discourages extensions of holidays. If it is necessary to lengthen a holiday, or take your child out of school for a trip during the term, parents should inform the Main Office in writing. Please note that teachers will not provide organized homework for unscheduled holidays that families take while school is in session.

School and Bus Cancellation Policy

School Cancellation Policy

Inclement weather may occasionally result in the closure of the school. Please note, if the bus is cancelled, it does not mean that the school is necessarily closed. Should the school be closed due to inclement weather, the school closure will be announced on B101, FM 93.1 and 107.5 FM radio stations, the A Channel and the main telephone greeting at the school.

Bus Cancellation Policy

Inclement weather may occasionally result in the cancellation of Simcoe County District school bus service which, when announced, includes the bus service to KBS. Please note, if the buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. It is the responsibility of parents/guardians to listen to the radio or television (B101, FM 93.1 and 107.5 FM radio stations, and the A Channel) for announcements and details about Simcoe County bus cancellations.

Bus Schedules

Parents/Guardians are required to submit a weekly bus schedule for their bus student(s). Weekly bus schedules are available inside each grade folder on the KBS website and at the Main Office. A weekly bus schedule is required to be completed and returned to the Main Office every Friday to outline the bus schedule you wish your child to have for the upcoming week.

Note: There will be a charge of \$25.00 incurred when changes are made to your child(ren)'s daily bus schedule, after 3:00 p.m. the day of the change.

Health and Safety Procedures

The safety and well being of your child(ren) while at KBS is extremely important. In the case of an emergency, it is essential that the Main Office has a Medical Release Form on file for your child(ren), and up to date data on your child(ren)'s Student Information Forms. It is the policy of Kempenfelt Bay School, that all activities be performed in the safest manner possible, consistent with good health and safety principles and practices, and in compliance with all workplace related legislation.

Procedure for Accident/Illness

If your child develops an illness or becomes injured during school hours, the teacher will send the child to the Main Office. An Accident/Illness Report will be completed, and the Main Office staff will contact the parents/guardians immediately, and discuss whether pick up from school is necessary.

Procedure for Emergencies

Parents/guardians will be contacted in the case of an emergency. If the student's parents/guardians cannot be reached, emergency contacts as listed on the child's Student Information Form, will be contacted. Transport to the nearest medical facility will then be arranged.

Administration of Medication

If there is a need for a child to take a prescribed medication during school hours, the parent/guardian must complete a Plan for Administration of Prescribed Medication Form, available from the Main Office. All medication sent to the school must comply with expiration date requirements, and will be kept in the Main Office. **Tylenol and other over-the-counter medications cannot be administered at the school unless prescribed by a physician, or confirmed by a parent/guardian in writing or verbally.**

Latex Free

Due to anaphylactic allergies in the school, no products made of latex, including balloons and gloves, are permitted in the school.

Nut Safe

Kempenfelt Bay School is a nut safe facility. Children are not permitted to bring any foods containing peanuts and/or tree nuts to school. In selecting the food that you send to school with your child(ren), please read the ingredients every time you purchase the product, as ingredients and manufacturing procedures can change at any time. Avoid foods that list any

of these ingredients: peanuts, nuts, cashews, pistachios, almonds, brazil nuts, hazelnuts, macadamia nuts, walnuts, pecans, nut oil, nu-nuts, nut butter, nut meals, nut paste, ground nuts, tree nuts and mixed nuts. Should you have any questions or wish a copy of a full list of nut safe foods, please contact the Main Office. The following is a small sample of acceptable items that students may bring for their snack or lunch.

Communication with Teachers

Parent – Teacher Interviews

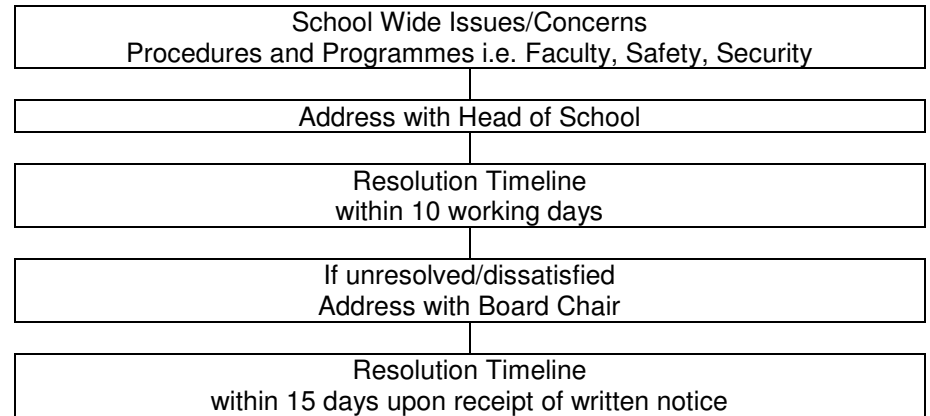
Parent – Teacher interviews are scheduled three times a year. The October interview is a time for new parents/guardians to share important information with the teacher. It is also a time for teachers to discuss how the student is adjusting to a new school, and to identify approaches to learning, specific to that child.

Interviews in December and March are to identify strengths and areas to work on, and to review goals. Students in JK to Grade 8 are required to attend the December and March interviews in order to be an active participant in the discussion. Samples of student work and goal setting will be the focus of these conversations.

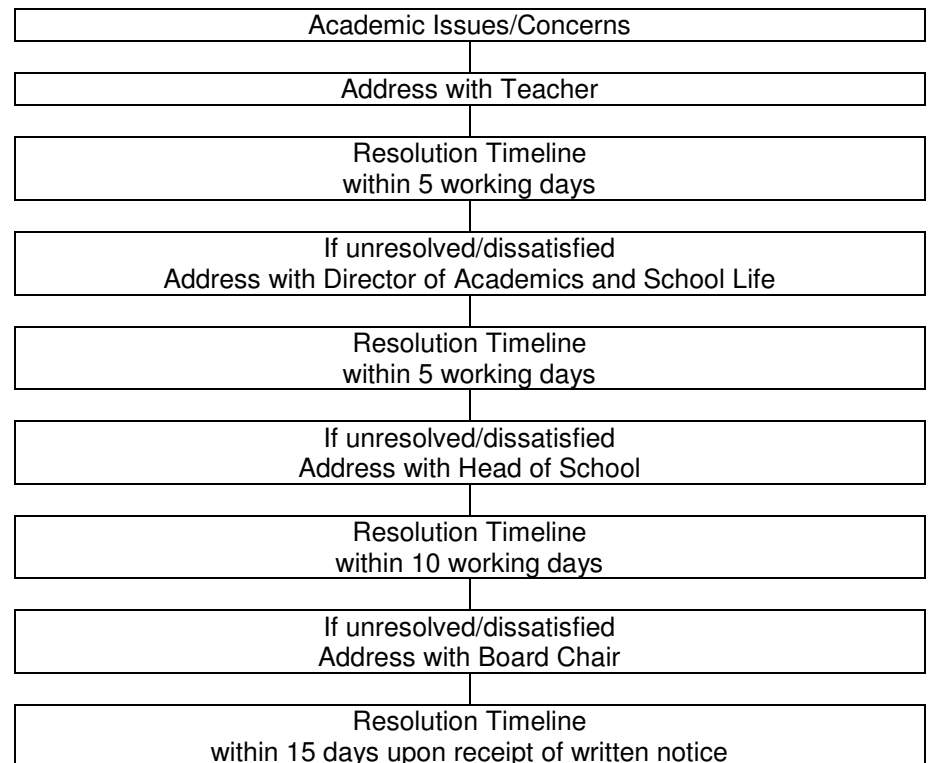
Thursday E-Memo

Homework and Projects

One of the aims of Kempenfelt Bay School is for all students to mature as independent learners and thinkers.

Homework, which is a valuable training experience, does help to teach a student how to study independently and how to take responsibility for completing assignments. Success in the academic field is greatly enhanced by efficient study and homework habits.

The following is our homework guideline:

Please note: Personal reading can be silent reading by the student or being read to by an adult.

Teachers of students in younger grades will expect project work to be completed on weekends. We do not assign homework on nights of significant celebrations or religious holidays or on evenings when students are involved in school functions.

Each child in Grades 2 to 8 will record his/her assignments in a Homework Agenda. Parents are invited to check it and sign it every night. Teachers must monitor and sign homework agendas on a daily/weekly basis. This enables us to monitor homework and also communicate to parents what homework has been assigned to their children. It also enables parents to communicate with the teachers, if they wish, by making notations in the Homework Agenda. The Homework Agenda is an excellent means of developing independent learners. Good study habits are developed early and are a valuable asset to students of all ages.

If a child needs help with his/her homework, a parent must use his or her own discretion as to the amount and type of help to be given. We would encourage parents to do no more than put their child on the right track, so that they can find the answers themselves.

Occasionally, homework may cause problems for parents and students. Parents should remember that a teacher can easily be reached by telephone, email or through the Homework Agenda. We do appreciate hearing your concerns.

Projects

A number of times throughout the year projects are assigned. The research skills and independent work-study skills gained are invaluable. A penalty may be imposed on projects where there has been more than "parental guidance" given. Parents are requested to allow the students to do their own work, particularly during the Science Fair.

Kempenfelt Bay School implements a research process that is uniform throughout the school and is easily adapted to every grade level. In this way, the students learn a consistent approach to investigation, research and reporting.

Academic Probation

Academic Probation applies to students who are in Grades 6 to 8. This policy is in place to ensure that students are fulfilling their academic responsibilities in terms of homework, projects and tests.

A student may be put on Academic Probation, for the following reasons:

- If within a one month period, a student achieves a grade of less than 60% on any two major assignments or tests.
- If within a three week period, three homework assignments are not completed to the teacher's satisfaction.

Students will incur a "warning" each time an assignment is completed in an unsatisfactory manner. Warnings will be communicated to parents through the use of an Academic Probation Student Report. This report will indicate the nature of the infraction.

The form must be signed by the parent/guardian and returned to the classroom teacher the next day. Reports that are not signed and returned will be considered as another warning on behalf of the student.

Academic Probation Consequences and Time Frames

Prior to serving the probationary period, a meeting will be held with the teacher and the parents/guardians of the student involved. If a student serves more than one probationary period, a meeting will be held with the Associate Head of School, the teacher, and parents/guardians.

During the Academic Probation period, the student involved will attend a supervised study hall from 3:45 - 4:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday. The Head of School or Associate Head of School will supervise. The student will not be permitted to attend any clubs, teams or participate in club-related activities during academic probation.

In the event that the student earns another strike while on Academic Probation, the student will immediately progress to the next level of probation.

Code of Behaviour

The goal of KBS is to develop students who are caring, truthful, respectful of the needs and abilities of others, proud of their accomplishments and involved in the school.

As children pass through the stages of emotional and social growth, they are met with challenges to their persona. It is the responsibility of the Head of School, faculty, and staff, in concert with the parents/guardians, to help students achieve positive emotional and inter-personal growth. Our Code of Behaviour will guide each student toward these goals. Support and commitment must be consistent and viable.

Our philosophy is rooted in the conviction that the education we offer our students is neither solely academic nor physical in nature, but also emotional. Students must be confident, without resorting to violence of any kind. Violence, or the threat of violence, will not be tolerated. Our goal is to develop an emotionally confident student within a supportive environment.

All students are expected to exhibit the qualities of good citizenship and respect in their daily life at KBS by:

- Respecting the property of the school, faculty, staff and fellow students.
- Showing pride in their school by wearing their uniform correctly and demonstrating appropriate behaviour at all times.

- Respecting the ideas and beliefs of other individuals and groups.
- Demonstrating loyalty to KBS by respecting the rules.
- Taking advantage of all opportunities for self-discipline and love of learning.

As a general rule, when behaviour is inappropriate, the severity of the consequence will be consistent with the nature and degree of the offence. Each case will be treated individually. No two actions or misdemeanors are exactly alike, nor are the needs of the students involved. When students are having difficulty following the Code of Behaviour, a process of supportive and corrective measures is followed. These actions may include:

- Probation: An ongoing monitoring process by the Head of School.
- Positive Behaviour Check: An opportunity for the faculty to comment on the student's improvement in the class setting.
- Discipline Check: An opportunity for the faculty to comment on disruptive behaviours in the class setting.
- Detentions: A faculty member has the option of issuing detentions depending on the individual situation. The faculty will inform the parents in person or by phone. Detentions may be served before school, during recess or after school.
- Suspension: At the discretion of the Head of School, a student may be suspended for a length of time, during which the student would not attend school.
- Dismissal: The school reserves the right to dismiss a student, when the continued attendance of that student would not be in his/her best interest or the school's. In such a circumstance, the school would make every reasonable effort to assist the family in securing a suitable alternative.

Code of Sportsmanship

Kempfenfelt Bay School teaches and supports the following Conference of Independent School Athletic Association (CISAA) code of sportsmanship:

- The rules of any game must be regarded as mutual agreements, the 'spirit of the letter' of which no one should try to evade or break.
- No advantages are to be sought except the advantage of superior skill.
- Officials and opponents must be regarded and treated as honest in intention.
- Decision of officials, no matter how unfair they may seem, must be accepted by players and coaches.
- Visiting teams and spectators are honoured guests, and should be treated as such. They should also behave as such.
- To win is always desirable; but to win at any cost utterly defeats the purpose of the game.

- Every team must learn that losing can be a triumph, when one's best has been given.
- Coaches, players, or spectators who do not fully support this code have 8 place in our representative matches.

True Sport

The True Sport Movement promotes an important yet basic concept. "True Sport is committed to the belief that sport makes a powerful and positive contribution to the development of people and communities, and to exploring the deeper connection between sport, community and values." Schools, communities teams, groups and individuals from coast to coast are joining forces to ensure that sports at all levels are providing a positive experience for all who participate. It is based on the belief that good sport builds lasting strength of character, as well as healthy, vibrant schools and communities, which are more socially connected.

At KBS, True Sport comes to life every time there is a Phys. Ed. class, an athletic team playing or clubs going on after school, where students help one another reach their personal best, while celebrating the joy that good sport can bring.

Uniforms and Dress Code

KBS has a dress code for the purpose of structure, school spirit and morale. A high standard of personal appearance is expected and clothing must be clean and in good repair at all times. Students are expected to wear full uniform to and from school, appropriate outerwear during the winter months and in periods of inclement weather. Infractions of the Dress Code will result in a warning and may progress to a suspension if not acted upon. **All items, including shoes and ties, must be labeled with the student's name.**

#1 Dress

#1 Dress is a formal uniform, to be worn every Friday, on field trips and on special events throughout the school year. It is a formal uniform that includes the KBS cardigan or vest for students in JK to Grade 2, and the KBS blazer for students in Grades 3 to 8.

#2 Dress is a casual uniform, to be worn Monday through Thursday. It includes the KBS turtleneck available in white and navy blue, or the KBS golf shirt available in white or navy blue with long or short sleeves.

The KBS uniform can be purchased new from the R.J. McCarthy outlet in Barrie, at 134 Anne Street South. Gently used school uniforms may be purchased at KBS from the racks located outside the Parent Council office.

Please note:

- all students in JK to Grade 3 will require a KBS sweatsuit, available through R.J. McCarthy, as part of their KBS uniform.
- all students in Grades 4 to 8 will require a KBS windsuit, available through R.J. McCarthy, as part of their KBS uniform.

Physical Education Uniform

JK, SK and Grade 1:

Students are not required to wear a Phys. Ed. uniform for gym; however, they are required to have a KBS sweatsuit for any outdoor activities and appropriate Velcro gym shoes (no black soles).

Grades 2 to 8:

Grades 2 to 8 are required to change for Phys. Ed classes. Their KBS Phys. Ed. uniform includes either a white crew neck t-shirt, Griffin Logo shirt or House t-shirt, navy shorts, white socks, and non-marking running shoes.

Grades 2 and 3 are required to have a KBS sweatsuit for any outdoor activities.

Grades 4 to 8 are required to have a KBS windsuit for any outdoor activities.

There is no variation from the KBS Phys. Ed. uniform. Parents/guardians are asked for their cooperation in ensuring their children are properly attired for Phys. Ed. classes and house activities in clean uniforms. Students are not permitted to borrow gym uniform items from other students.

Hair, Make-up and Accessories

All students are expected to have clean and well-groomed hair that is kept away from their faces. Boys must keep their hair conservatively cut, out of their eyes, and off the collar of their shirt. No student is permitted to dye his/her hair a colour that is not a natural shade. Girls are to be conservative in the quantity and use of hair accessories. Nail polish and make-up are not permitted.

Shoes

Students are to wear black leather polishable lace-up, buckle, velcro or loafer shoes. Patent leather or party shoes, slipper-like or ballet type shoes are not acceptable. For safety purposes, heels on girl's shoes must not be higher than 1½ inches. Crocs are not permitted on the playground.

Jewellery

No medals, bracelets, chains or beads are to be worn. Boys are not permitted to wear earrings. Girls' earrings are not to dangle. Rings are to be worn conservatively.

Gum

The chewing of gum is not permitted within the school, or on the grounds, at any time. This includes extra-curricular activities and off-property events.

Loss Prevention

All student uniforms will be checked for name labels on September 21st – Label Day. House Points will be earned for each item that is appropriately labeled. **Please label all articles of clothing, books, sports equipment or any other objects your child may bring to school. Remember to label new articles that may have seasonal usage, such as boots and gloves.** Students will be responsible for replacing lost/damaged text books and library books.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted within the school, on the grounds, or at any function where KBS is represented.

Alcohol/Drugs

Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs within the school, on the grounds, on school trips, or during related school functions is not permitted at any time, and will result in an immediate suspension or may lead to expulsion of the student.

Banned Articles

Students are not to bring any replica weapons (cap guns, water pistols, etc.) to school. This ban also includes knives of any sort. Valuables, MP3 players, iPods and electronic games are not permitted at school or on field trips as these may be easily lost or damaged. Cell phones are not permitted on school property. Any communication between students and parents will occur through the Main Office.

The House System at Kempenfelt Bay School

The House System

There are four houses at Kempenfelt Bay School named after our founding families. They are Christie House, Feigel House, Labatt House and Morrice House. Upon entering KBS, every student is assigned to one of these houses, where they retain their membership in the house for as long as they attend KBS and once they become alumni. Siblings usually belong to the same house. Each faculty member also belongs to a house.

House Competition

The house system is a valuable tool to foster camaraderie and co-operation among students and faculty. It promotes healthy competition, school spirit and provides an avenue to allow each student to be welcomed into the KBS community. House points are awarded on an individual or team basis. Students are awarded individual house points for exhibiting behaviours that are in keeping with the KBS philosophy. On a team basis, students gain points through participation in house events and competitions. House points are announced at the end of each month. The House Championship Trophy is awarded during the Prize Day Ceremony, to the house that has accumulated the highest point total at the end of the year. There is also a trophy awarded to the student who has achieved the most individual points.

Student Leadership Opportunities at Kempenfelt Bay School

Head Prefects

The Head Prefects are ambassadors for KBS and are members of the Grade 8 class. They are responsible for leading the House Heads, Sports and Arts Heads, and for fostering an appropriate standard of behaviour within the student population. The various duties include assisting faculty members, speaking at assemblies and teaching the KBS values to younger students.

House Heads

These students are responsible for the organization and direction of their houses in the house system. Their duties include fostering participation by house members in house events, organizing house teams, representing their house at assemblies and welcoming and learning the names of new students, all with the assistance of the house faculty.

Sports Head, Music and Art Head

These students are responsible for promoting these areas through planned activities and displays. Their mentors are the teachers of these subjects.

Clubs, Activities and Teams

At Kempenfelt Bay School, we believe in teaching to the whole child, and that a complete education comes with participation in extra-curricular activities. It is our responsibility to ensure that each student has an opportunity to shine. Self-confidence is critical to the success of one's education, and students derive a strong sense of self-worth from acting in a musical production, playing on a team, exploring art, learning a new skill, or performing in the band. To this end, KBS offers clubs throughout the school year, providing a wide range of grade-appropriate choices including sports, crafts, and other extra-curricular activities. You will receive a Club Sign-Up Form for your child(ren) each term.

The KBS faculty agree that teachable moments after 3:30 p.m. are as important as those before. It is the responsibility of all full-time faculty members to lead a club, activity or team each term.

Last year, KBS students participated in many after-school activities including soccer, basketball, cross country running, track and field, co-operative games, bands, chess/checkers, school-wide musical, baking, arts, crafts, knitting, broomball and the yearbook club. Please feel free to bring extra-curricular ideas to the Associate Head of School.

If a student is participating in an after school activity, he/she will remain under the supervision of the coach/leader. If your child is not picked up at the end of the activity, he/she will be signed into the After Four Programme.

We ask for your cooperation to ensure that your child(ren) is picked up on time from practices, games, and activities.

Fundraising at Kempenfelt Bay School

We can run a great school with tuition funds, but we can grow and offer additional, excellent opportunities with the support of fundraising. The school has two major fundraisers in the school year. The Griffin Fund Campaign is launched in October and runs throughout the year. Your support of the

campaign, and ultimately our students, is invaluable in maintaining academic excellence, enriched resources and extra-curricular programmes. All members of the KBS community are asked to participate to whatever degree they can, and as a not-for-profit organization, a tax receipt will be issued for your donation or gift in kind.

Secondly, KBS, in conjunction with a very active committee, runs an Annual Fundraising Evening in the month of May. Details concerning this important fundraising event will be forwarded to you toward the end of the winter months. Attendance is greatly appreciated and fun is had by all.

As in all Independent Schools, fundraising for external initiatives and community service are extremely important, as we are all Simcoe County and global citizens. We encourage input, feedback, and new ideas. Please feel welcome to speak with the Head of School, at any time, to discuss fundraising ideas, volunteer participation or school advancement.
